At approximately 6:30 a.m. Thursday, November 8, the Camp Fire was sparked outside of Paradise, California. By evening, due to extremely low humidity and high winds, the fire was spreading at the rate of "80 football fields per minute," according to media outlets—leaving little or no time for residents to flee their homes.

At this writing, the blaze has killed at least 88 people, 196 are still missing, and more than 13,000 homes and 400 commercial buildings were destroyed. Miraculously, the Paradise Alliance Church (PAC) is still standing, though "almost no one in the church has a home or job to go back to," Central Pacific District Superintendent Ray Van Gilst reported.

Nearby, Neighborhood Church of Chico (NC Chico) has been caring for PAC members and serving as an evacuation center–housing, feeding, and providing medical care for nearly 400 evacuees at one point. The Sunday after the fire started, 2,000 people gathered at NC Chico for a combined service with PAC. Josh Gallagher, PAC's lead pastor, spoke, acknowledging his own grief and

encouraging others to allow themselves to grieve as well. "As I walked through the main NC Chico sanctuary, seeing people sitting in their seats weeping told me this was exactly what [they] needed," Ray said.

Others in the Alliance family have stepped up to care for these devastated communities. Bayside Church of Granite Bay (Sacramento) has partnered with the Central Pacific District and PAC to meet the great needs. Bayside Church leaders met with PAC staff to pray for them and give them gift cards. They also took a special offering for Paradise Alliance Church, raising \$112,000 in one day.

"Our friends in Paradise and Chico need your prayers," Ray said. Pray for those who have lost loved ones, homes, and possessions, as well as for area pastors and district leaders as they seek God for wisdom toward the restoration of fire–stricken communities.
