How to Grow in Prayer

Praying on Your Own

- 1. Set aside a regular time for prayer.
- 2. Find a quiet place-bedroom, boiler room, or board room!
- 3. Spend a few minutes in praise. Your Bible study should lead you into this.
- 4. Deal with matters of repentance. Ask yourself:

a) What did I do that I should not have done?

b) What did I fail to do that I ought to have done? Be Specific.

5. Then start asking. Consider the Lord's Prayer for details. A prayer list of people for whom you wish to pray may be helpful. In your notebook or diary make a list of the people for whom you will pray each day. You may like to work out a system of praying for different groups on different days. For example:

Sunday pray for saints . . . Church members, the pastor, deacons, elders,

Monday pray for missionaries . . . Get a list from your Missions Board

Tuesday pray for teachers . . . Sunday school, public school, High School.

Wednesday pray for workmates and neighbors (bosses as well!)

Thursday pray for troubled people . . . Sick, divorced, starving, imprisoned.

Friday pray for seekers . . . Those who don't know the Lord.

This is the list I have drawn up for my own use. You may develop one more suitable for your purposes. If not, use this one!

6. Conclude with some prayer for yourself. Deal with your own fears, hopes, desires, and weaknesses.
