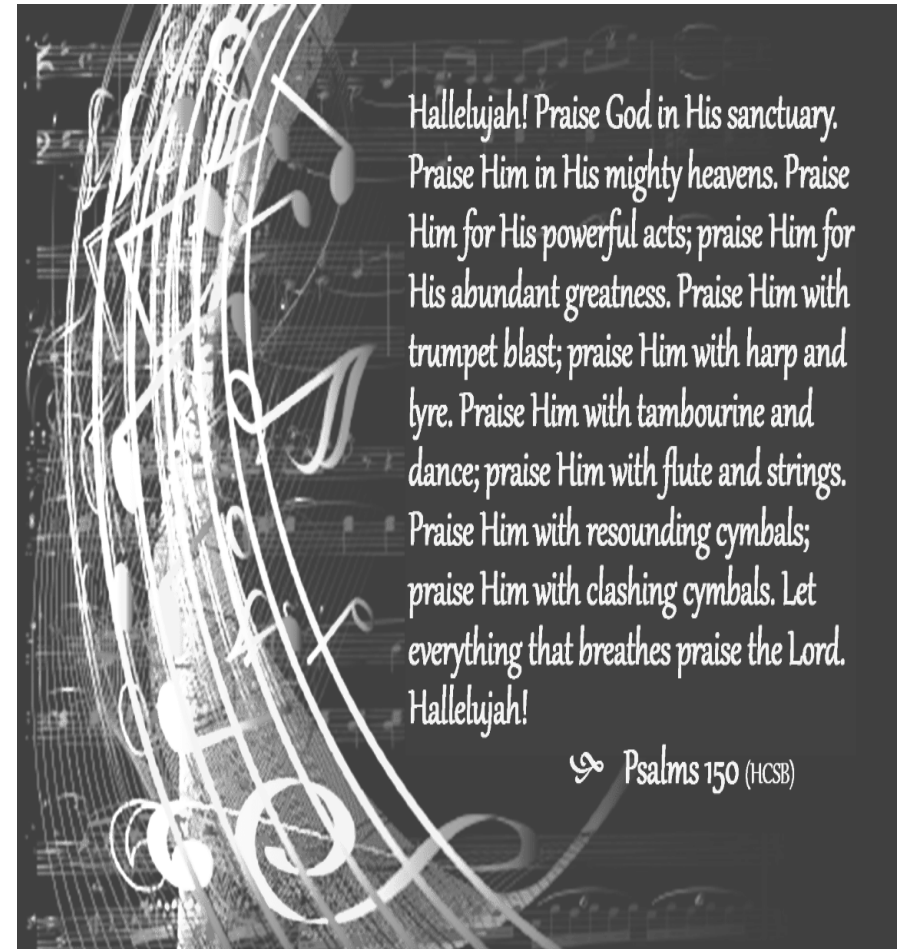
The Sacrifice That Lives and Breathes
